This January we unveiled our 2022 Campaign "Step Right Up"

This past August, one set of steps for the Presidential Office Car, had rusted and fallen off. Fortunately, through our fundraising efforts, we raised \$3,500 to have them repaired. This brought to our attention that we must follow up on plans that were started several years ago building a cover to help protect our rail cars. Sitting on a static track and being exposed to the elements is hard on these precious pieces of history.

Our goal is to raise \$50,000 with this campaign. As of today, there is 37% pledged toward this target. What are our plans for the \$50,000?

- \$10,000 to paint the tops of the rail cars. This is a special paint that acts as a sealant and similar to paint used on mobile homes
- \$10,000 in annual rail car maintenance. Fixing the rail cars is an ongoing necessity and often require custom made replacements.
- \$30,000 to bring on Omni Architects, a firm familiar with our property and its historical significance. Their task is to design a structure to completely cover the rail cars, create a space to rent and generate revenue, and be aesthetically pleasing. Once these plans are complete, a realistic cost estimate will be available for the next step.

Remembering Pat O'Rourke

About the time he retired from Sears, Pat decided that he wanted to play with his toy trains. At that time the sHOw Modular Railroad Club was ending its stay at the B.R.I.M.S. Museum on Center St. and preparing to move to the new L&N Depot location. In early 2007 Pat joined the Club and he found out what Friends of L&N Depot were doing to create a brand-new Museum and train consist. He liked what he saw. That was a lucky day for the Depot!

In early 2007 the Museum and Gift Shop build out was in full swing, and construction of the benchwork for the sHOw Club lay-



out was underway as well. Outside, volunteers were busy repairing the rusted out RPO roof, and sandblasting and painting the car. Pat occupied himself helping with the museum buildout. When RPO interior work began Pat was on the job almost every weekday piecing the burn damaged floor together, refinishing the overhead boxes and more. That continued through 2008 and 2009. Pat was invited to join the Friends of L&N Depot Board in April 2009, and in 2014 became Restoration Chairman. In the summer of 2009, Pat, Donnie Firkins, and Dorian Walker went to Steamtown in Pennsylvania to salvage interior parts needed to finish the RPO. They came back very hot and dirty, bringing a box truck full of RPO treasures necessary to complete the restoration. That summer became a sprint to finish the car in time for its October 27, 2009, dedication. Work then turned to construction of the engine interior displays. Adrian Garner and Pat worked together on the interior, and Jim Lockwood ran the electric service for the unit.

Through the years, Pat set up thousands of chairs and tables for Depot events, ran errands, cut the grass, even performing janitorial duties when there was no budget for one. There were many other restoration and building maintenance chores as well.

A new and daunting challenge was the unexpected acquisition of Glasgow Railway Co. 109, the Jim Crow car. By late 2010 and into 2011 volunteers moved the car to a siding at Glasgow Depot for sandblasting, painting, and preparation for transport to Bowling Green. In August the car was transported to Trace Die Cast for an 18-month complete reconstruction. Pat was there every day to coordinate volunteer work, accomplishing tasks we would have to pay the Contractor to perform. And painting. Endless painting! Moving day of the beautiful rebuilt car was February 11, 2013.

Pat was on the crew dispatched to Louisville to evaluate the Hospital Car, and in 2011 it was moved to the Depot. The restoration crew installed HVAC and electric service, while work on the windows was being done. When budgets allowed, Pat, Jim, Dick, and Adrian prepared the car for painting. The remaining side was repainted in 2020 and Pat, then undergoing treatment, saw to installing the lettering and completing the exterior. This would be his last project.

Pat O'Rourke gave Historic Railpark & Train Museum the gift of himself for uncounted thousands of hours in the completion of all kinds of useful tasks in the 15 years we shared. He touched every area of the Depot, grounds, and Railcars. Thank you, Pat! You are a true and proven Friend of the L&N Depot!

Museum Update

Glen Browning donated a Railroad Track Gauge and Level to the Railpark Museum. This vintage item has been added to the "Business of the Railroad" exhibit on the second floor of the museum.

A Railroad Track Gauge and level was used to check the gauge of a railroad track and measure rail superelevation on curves.

The small railroad cast iron caboose coal stove has been moved to the second floor of the Rail-Park Museum.
